National History Day Georgia

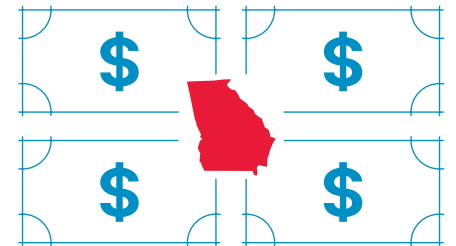
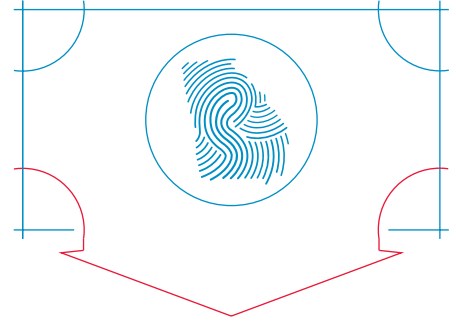
Using primary and secondary resources, middle- and high school students conduct and present original research by creating an exhibit, essay, documentary, performance, or website.

- Woodstock student Aidan Snyder also won an award from the Georgia World War I Centennial Commission at the state contest for National History Day Georgia, for his exhibit on the First World War.
